# **REPORTS & RECOMMENDATIONS OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS**

## CAO/Clerk – Stage 3 Reopening

CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council concerning Stage 3 reopening of pools and the daycares. The CAO advised that the Province's Stage 3 reopening announcements have made significant changes to daycare operations noting that effective July 27<sup>th</sup>, rather than operating at half capacity, daycares will be allowed 15 children in a cohort. He noted that for the Vanastra Early Years Centre, the licensed capacity for preschool groups was 16. He also noted that opening the daycare under the new guidelines would allow some flexibility for the Vanastra pool to open with limited programs as a second staff person in the building was required for the pool to be open.

He further advised that the Vanastra Recreation Manager has scheduled her inspection of the pool by the Health Unit on July 31<sup>st</sup> and she anticipates running her pool sessions for her lifeguard courses during the week of August 4<sup>th</sup>.

The CAO advised that some time was required to establish new COVID policies and train staff and some time is needed to clean and organize the daycare rooms. The Daycare Supervisor is projected to come back to work the week of July 22<sup>nd</sup>, but the majority of the staff will not be recalled until a week before the daycare is opened. The projected reopening for the daycare is August 11<sup>th</sup>.
