Andrew Glenn attended the meeting to hear the proceedings of Council.

CALL TO ORDER & MAYOR'S REMARKS

Mayor Bernie MacLellan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor MacLellan noted that he had attended the Remembrance Day ceremony in Seaforth to lay a wreath on behalf of the Municipality and he stated that he was impressed in how well the ceremony was organized to comply with Covid-19 protocols and the individuals who chose to attend the event to pay respects were very cognizant of social distancing during the ceremony.

Mayor MacLellan also noted that in response to a request for input from Huron Perth Medical Officer of Health Dr. Miriam Klassen, he along with the CAO had drafted a letter to Dr. Klassen suggesting that with an active educational campaign, that it was the hope of Huron East to remain in the Prevent Zone (Green) rather than moving into the Protect Zone (Yellow). He noted that the Municipality had provided a timely response, but with the increase in Covid-19 cases in Huron-Perth, the County was moved into the Protect category before she received the letter – the Mayor noted he was supportive of the Medical Officer of Health's decision and acknowledged that the potential for a quick spread of the virus required quick and proactive decisions by the Medical Officer of Health.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Mid-Huron Landfill Site

Mayor MacLellan advised that the volume of leachate at the Mid-Huron landfill site had not decreased as anticipated after the installation of the final clay cover. Committee members and staff are continuing to meet with the consulting engineer to find solutions, but a solution could have a significant impact on the financial reserves of the site.

Huron Out of the Cold: Heart to Home Program

Deputy Mayor Bob Fisher advised the County of Huron has expanded the efforts of the previous Out of the Cold program, with increased funding and staff specially trained in trauma informed care, substance use, and mental health services. The new program aims to provide an emergency shelter that also offers wrap-around supports for homeless individuals in Huron County.

Consent Applications C58/20 and C59/20 – Kyle and Lori Henderson

Councillor Ray Chartrand inquired of the Mayor on the status of the consent applications of Kyle and Lori Henderson (C58/20 and C59/20) noting that Huron East had not provided clear direction on the application.

Mayor MacLellan advised the County of Huron had approved consent applications C58/20 and C59/20 of Kyle and Lori Henderson to provide for 3 residential lots on the property.

Virtual Council Meetings

Councillor John Lowe advised that Huron-Perth Health Unit region is currently in the Yellow Protect level of the provincial COVID-19 response framework and questioned whether in-person Council meetings were essential and suggested a return to virtual format. Council were in agreement to returning to a virtual meeting format.
